

Terminal Objectives of the Program

At the completion of the courses in the Health Care UST MBA program, the student will be able to:

- Discuss the principles of financial and managerial accounting, and health care economics and their application to medical groups and health care organizations.
- Identify how theories, research, models, and methods in human resource management and human behavior contribute to reaching organizational goals.
- Outline the knowledge and skills needed to become an effective, highly principled health care leader.
- Discuss and respond to a wide variety of ethical, legal, and regulatory issues and situations.
- Discuss trends in providing and financing care in changing governments and markets, and the implications for clinics, medical groups, and health professionals.
- Describe the impact of epidemiological factors on the usage and delivery patterns of medical care and management of populations.
- Discuss the underlying concepts and functions of managed care.
- Select appropriate statistical methods to assist in decision making.
- Describe the fundamental operations management concepts and how they apply to health care operations in clinical and support services.
- Integrate the knowledge, tools, and skills gained in the MBA courses to the formulation and implementation of organizational strategy and policy.
- Integrate as many MBA courses as possible in the preparation and presentation of a major project or issue.
